Work Health and Safety – OHS to WHS

Changes, changes and more changes! New work health and safety (WHS) laws replaced the occupational health and safety (OHS) laws in NSW in January this year, so from now on you will hear people referring to WHS, not OHS. The changes were made to ensure consistency between states.

There will be greater emphasis on duty of care, with a broader definition of **worker** to include anyone working in any capacity (including a volunteer capacity) in a business or organisation.

Each worker (even if a volunteer) "has a duty to take reasonable care of their own health and safety while at work and also take reasonable care that their conduct does not adversely affect the health and safety of other persons at the workplace".

At PBNC, volunteers have always been treated as workers as far as work health and safety is concerned. Volunteers undergo work health and safety induction, hold meetings regularly and assess tasks and address risks involved in those tasks. So volunteers won't notice many changes but will be asked to participate and cooperate as the centre's procedures are updated to ensure compliance with the new laws.

Businesses and organisations will have until December to implement the new legislation.
