#### This Plan ensures PBNC will be:


- ⇒ open, connected and fully responsive to community needs;

We offer...


- - an agent and access point for C'th Department of Human Services (including Centrelink)





We offer a wide range of activities which attract people of all ages, stages, backgrounds and circumstances. We are often the first 'port of call' for people who are in very difficult situations and who need assistance. People come to us from Pottsville, other Tweed Coast communities, and more broadly across the Tweed Shire. Our holiday location means that international and interstate visitors also access our services.

We pride ourselves on the strength of our partnerships with other organisations in our region, and work seamlessly with these partners to ensure every person who comes through our door receives appropriate, wrap-around support when they need it.

We are a not-for-profit, registered charity and an incorporated association. While we receive some term-limited federal and NSW government funding for specific services, but we rely on the community's support of our social enterprises for the majority of our funding. As a non-profit, every dollar raised through these enterprises goes back into providing much-needed support for the community.
