Pottsville Beach Neighbourhood Centre provides a wide range of supports and service options designed to assist disadvantaged Tweed Shire people, including individuals and families at risk of disengagement, people experiencing homelessness and other life challenges, including being subjected to, or healing from, domestic violence.

We walk alongside First Nations people and participate wholeheartedly in local and national activities to promote truth telling, respect and self-determination.

Established in 2000, we are the only not-for-profit organisation offering generalist human services on the Tweed Coast in far Northern NSW.

We offer...

- ❖ Our respect for the Goodjinburra (also known as Coodjingburra) people of the Bundjalung Nation. We extend our respect to Elders past and present for their custodianship of the land and waters where we live, work and play.
- ❖ a range of in-house services, offering a suite of programs and supports, including child and family services, an outlet for family preservation services, digital skills' tutoring and technology support, mentoring and volunteering
- ❖ referral and advocacy linkages to supports that are available elsewhere
- ❖ an Australian Services' Agent and Access Point for Centrelink, Medicare and Child Support customers
- ❖ An accessible community hub, accommodating visiting practitioners to provide a wide range of community services and activities, such as counselling, legal advice, disability employment services and allied health consultations
- ❖ opportunities for people to interact, connect and participate

- ♦ **Community Reach**

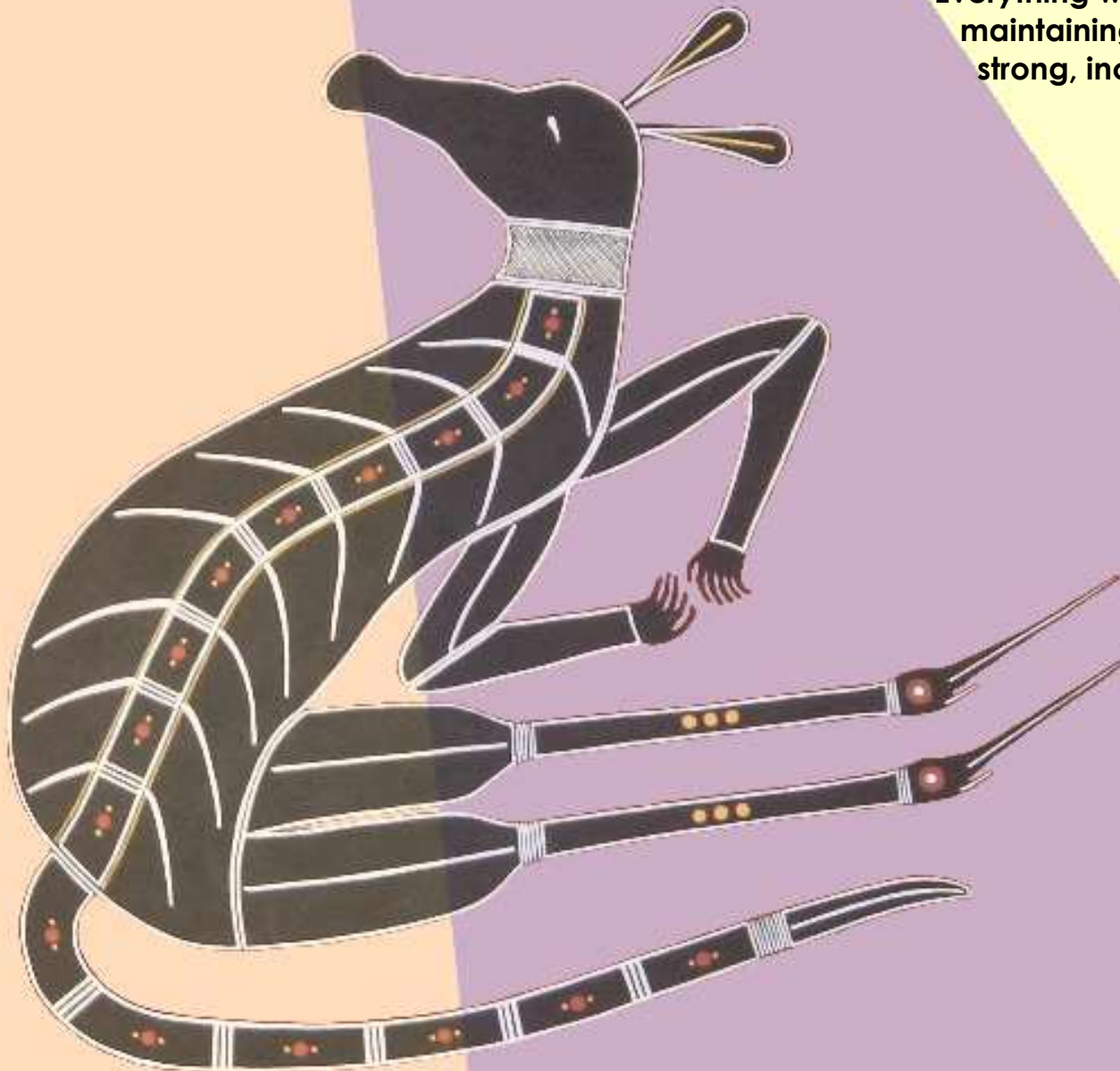

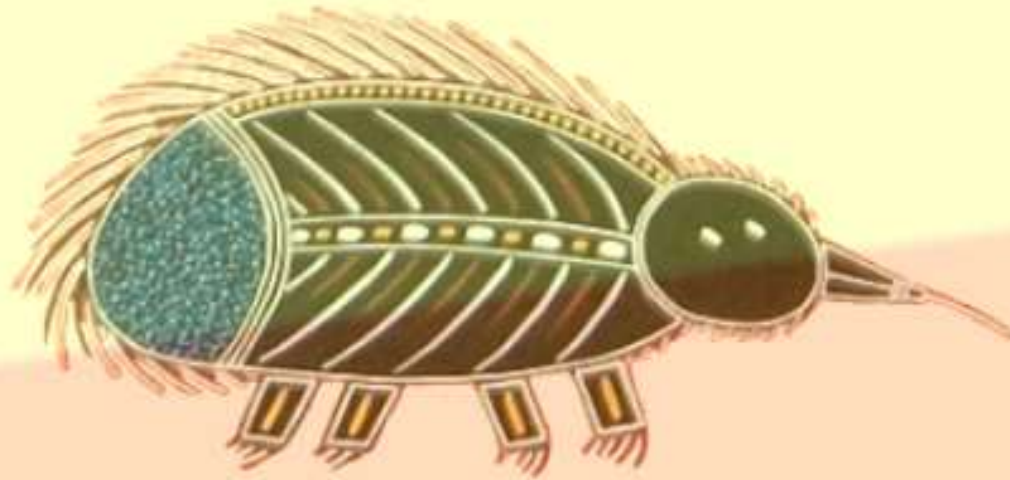
Our vision...

The right of people to make choices in their own lives.

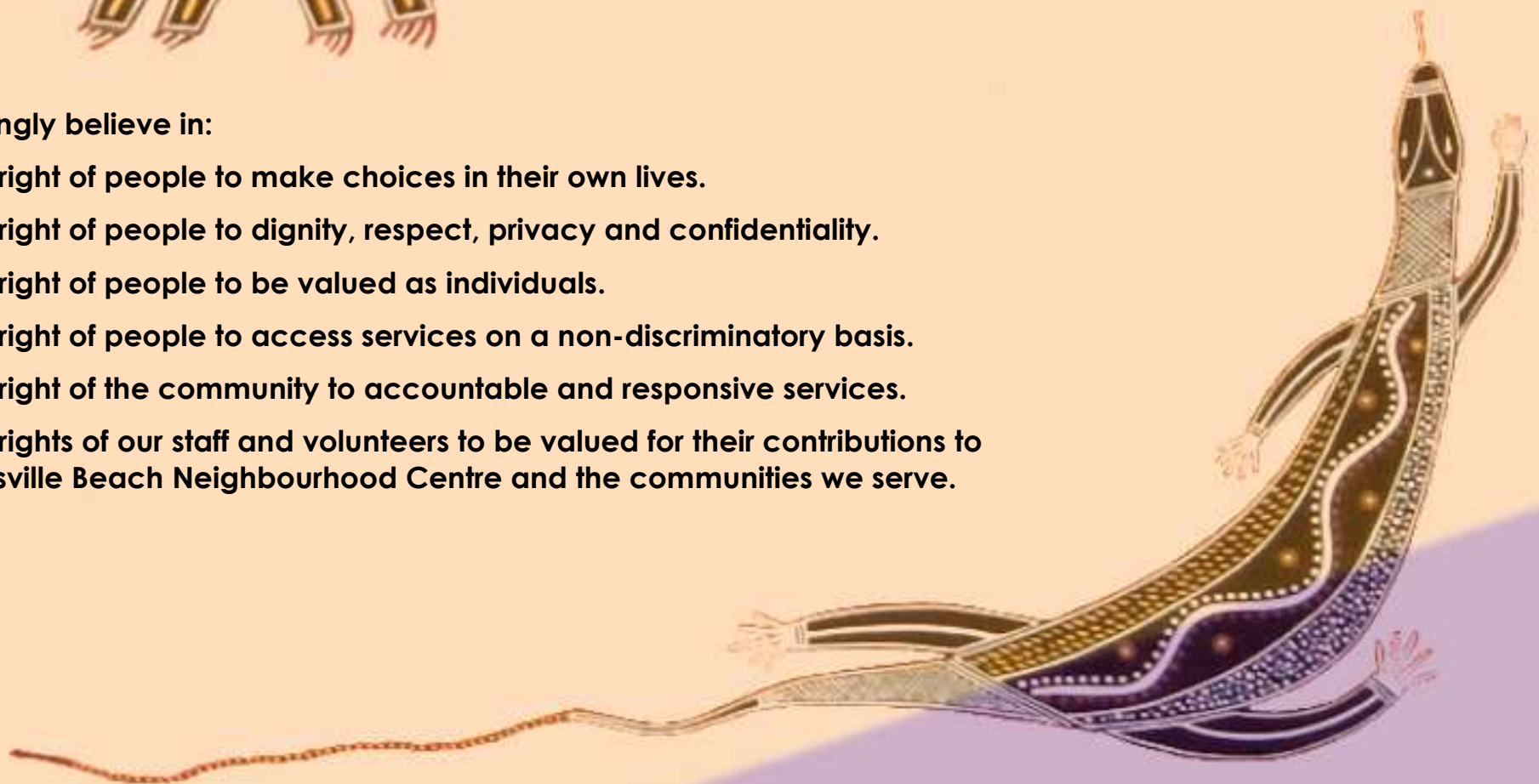
The right of people to dignity, respect, privacy and confidentiality.
